



Coach / Player / Spectator Conduct Policy

Coaches, players, and spectators are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful manner toward all participants, and all officials. All participants are to abide by all directives from The Harris County Precinct 3 Commissioner and Harris County Law Enforcement

Referees have the full authority to remove any person from the premises, at their sole discretion, who they deem to be disruptive, abusive, or disrespectful. Ejection from a game constitutes removal from the field as a participant or spectator. Failure to leave may result in the referee declaring a forfeit and law enforcement police being contacted.

Members of the Cy-Fair Iron Maidens Board of Directors or park officials, who are not involved in a current game, have the same authority as the referees regarding the conduct of any participant.

All players, coaches, and spectators must abide by the current Harris County COVID protocols to participate in the Burning Flower.

Any spectator ejected from a game is automatically suspended from attending any remaining events for the day. The Cy-Fair Iron Maidens Board of Directors reserves the right to determine the ultimate length of the suspension at its sole discretion.

If a head coach, assistant coach, or player is ejected, he/she may not participate in the remaining day's events. If the person is participating with multiple teams, this suspension will apply to all his/her teams.

Any person ejected for a second time will be asked to leave the entire event & will be asked to not return for the next year.

The Cy-Fair Iron Maidens Board of Directors reserves the right to increase the penalty for an ejection or any other infraction of a coach, player, or spectator to include termination of any future relationship with Cy-Fair Iron Maidens, The Burning Flower Tournament, or the Julia Briggs Foundation.
